## **Deeper Connection Study**



# Read Luke 5:1-11 (cf. Matt. 4:18-22; Mark 1:16-20; John 1:40-42)

- After teaching the people, what does Jesus ask Simon to do (v. 4)? How would you describe Simon's response (v. 5)?
- 2. What amazing thing happens (vv. 6-7)? How does this affect Simon Peter and his partners (vv. 9-11)?
- 3. What charge does Jesus give to Simon (v. 10b; cf. Matt. 4:19; Mk. 1:17)? What does Jesus mean by these words?
- 4. How is this event similar and different from Matthew 4:18-22 and Mark 1:16-20?
- 5. What has Jesus asked you to do that has stretched your faith? How have you responded?
- 6. How do *you* follow Jesus? How does the call of discipleship apply to you?

**PRAYER TO THE POINT:** Praise God for the invitation to follow Christ. Pray for courage to follow Jesus and to obey his will. Ask God to strengthen your faith in his provisions and plan for you. Pray for others to follow Christ.
