Deeper Connection Study

It is a privilege for disciples to represent Jesus. In doing the Lord's work, we also realize that not everyone welcomes Jesus or his messengers. Jesus sends out his disciples with authority, but also with eyes wide open. *Today's Core Practice discussed: Giving Away My Faith.*

Read Luke 10:1-16

1. Why does Jesus send out disciples two-by-two?
2. In Jesus' words, how does he send them out (v. 3)? Why does he tell them this?
3. What command does Jesus give them about when they enter a house (vv. 5-7)? Why does he mention peace and wages?
4. How does Jesus prepare them to respond to acceptance and rejection in entering a town (vv. 8-11)? Why does Jesus utter woes against some towns of Galilee (vv. 12-15)?
5. What is the significance of Jesus' words in verse 16? How does this reveal the importance of the disciples' ministry?
6. How have you been equipped and empowered to represent Jesus? How do you deal with people who reject your message and ministry?

PRAYER TO THE POINT: Praise God that he allows us to represent Jesus. Pray for boldness and alertness as you share the gospel with others. Ask God to allow you favor with others and for them to receive your words as Jesus' words to them.



Every believer has a co-worker, classmate, friend, or family member who does not know Christ. More than likely nothing would make that believer happier than to have that person they care about come to faith in Jesus. There are many obvious reasons for that desire, but one consistent cause is because God has put that longing in the hearts of believers. To be a true follower of Christ expects that there will be a concern about the eternal destiny of the people that surround you. Yet, in spite of that concern that each believer has, few actually share the good news with the people who are outside God's family. Why is that? Well the most common reason is fear, and particularly the fear of rejection.

It is comforting to know that Jesus recognizes that his followers sometimes have fear. It was for this reason that he exhorts the believer to "not be ashamed of him and his words," (Lk. 9:26). Additionally, he reminds his disciples if they are rejected, not to be troubled because the person the people are really rejecting is Jesus himself. However, he didn't stop with this information, he went on to communicate how the disciple can overcome his or her fear. So, if it has been a while since you shared your faith, get ready to conquer your fear!
