- 4. How is this correspondence and proposed arrangement of visits deeply personal for Paul?
- 5. What sacrifices are made for the church in the cause of Christ? How is this instructive for us? Who have been your role models of this kind of Christian living?
- 6. How deep are your commitments and relationships at church? How do you serve in God's kingdom work?

Finding Joy in Tough Times

t has been discovered that as the use of technology and smart phones has increased that members of society have become more and more isolated. This state has a number of dilemmas, which include an increase of depression among users, as well as a decreased ability to write and communicate. However, one of the increasing quandaries of this trend is that people have fewer friends. Subsequently many parents struggle to help their children find good friends and not be led away by bad influences that exploit innocent youth who are desperate for peer approval.

The Bible has a lot to say about what it takes to develop godly friendships. We see examples of great friendships in the Old Testament narratives with people like David and Jonathon, Elijah and Elisha, and Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego. The New Testament also has a lot to say about friendships, and the Apostle Paul was one of the most articulate when it came to godly friendship. In his letter to the Philippians he describes two of his dear friends, Timothy and Epaphroditus, and in doing so, he provides four characteristics of a great friend.
